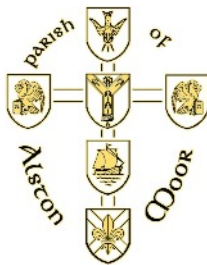

Pentecost

At Pentecost (from the Greek *pentekoste*, 'fiftieth'), on the fiftieth day of Easter God sends his Holy Spirit, to empower his people to perform the mission which the risen Christ has entrusted to them: on this day, the Church is born.

The risen Lord is no longer present in the flesh; the Church is now to be the new body of Christ, filled with his life through the gift of the Spirit.

On this day of great celebration, the last day of Eastertide, red – the colour of fire – reminds us of the Holy Spirit descending in tongues like flames.

Gathering in God's Presence

THE WELCOME

We stand as the ministers enter

Welcome in the name of Christ.

God's grace, mercy and peace be with you

Words of welcome or introduction may be said

- ◆ We come from diverse lives to meet with God. Let us recognize God's presence among us.

Silence is kept.

- ◆ Whether present in this building, or joining in online

All We are united in the love of Christ.

We light the Paschal Candle in church, and our candles at home, as a sign of Christ's presence among us

Alleluia. Christ is risen.

All He is risen indeed. Alleluia.

INTRODUCTION

Jesus Christ, whom we worship, is our crucified, risen and ascended Lord, and we have walked with him through his journey of love.

We have faced the agony of his suffering and death on a cross. We have rejoiced at his bursting free from the bonds of death.

We have enjoyed his risen presence with us and his revelation of himself through the breaking of bread.

We have seen his return to the throne
before which every knee shall bow
and every tongue confess
that this Jesus is Lord.

And now, with the followers of his own time,
we await the coming
of the promised Holy Spirit,
his gift to his people, through whom
we make Christ known to the world.

THE COLLECT (PRAYER FOR THE WEEK)

Let us pray
that the Spirit will work through our lives
to bring Christ to the world.

Silence is kept

Holy Spirit, sent by the Father,
ignite in us your holy fire;
strengthen your children
with the gift of faith,
revive your Church
with the breath of love,
and renew the face of the earth,
through Jesus Christ our Lord.

All **Amen.**

When he left his followers,
she was poured out on all flesh
and crossed the line
between male and female,
slave and free, Jew and gentile.

She is with us now, bringing Christ near,
filling our worship, guiding us in hope.

Therefore, with all God's rainbow people,
and all who have tasted the Spirit of life,
with the thirsty and the cold,
and all who long to dream again,
we worship your glory
as heaven touches earth:

All **Holy, holy, holy Lord,
God of power and might,
heaven and earth are full of your glory.
Hosanna in the highest.**

So with Jesus we praise you,
with Jesus we pray
for healing for our hurting world,
for locked doors to be flung open,
for your resurrection life to be known,
and for the world to be renewed
by your Holy Spirit
as we proclaim with confidence:

All **Christ has died, Christ is risen,
Christ will come again.**

As all creation waits with eager longing
for the revealing of the children of God,
send your Spirit on us
that we may be channels of your peace,
witnesses to your hope,
and dwellers in your joy,
through Jesus Christ,
life-giver, pain-bearer, love-maker.

SHARING GOD'S PEACE

We stand

The minister introduces the Peace with words such as

The Spirit bears fruit
in love, joy, peace, patience,
faithfulness, gentleness and self control;
to each the Spirit is given
for the common good of all. Alleluia.

The peace of the Lord
be always with you

All **And also with you. Alleluia.**

◆ Let us offer one another a sign of peace

All may exchange a sign of peace with immediate neighbours, for example in sign language, or with a handshake and greeting such as "Peace be with you" or "Christ is risen"

The Offertory is taken during this hymn

PRAYER OF THANKSGIVING

We remain standing

The Lord is here

All **His Spirit is with us.**

Lift up your hearts

All **We lift them to the Lord.**

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

All **It is right to give thanks and praise.**

God of wind and flame,
we praise your wild beauty
flying free in the shining air.

Your Spirit nurtured life
in outrageous diversity;
she raised up judges to protect the weak,
made kings dance in ecstasy,
and prophets burn with holy anger.

Through the Spirit, the Word became flesh
and the world was called to hear his voice;
she drove him to the desert,
his first sure step to victory
over death and division.



Listening & Responding to God

READING

We sit as we listen to a reading from the Bible

At the end the reader says

God be in our listening
All **and in our understanding.**

A Psalm may also be read

HYMN

We stand

GOSPEL READING

We remain standing

The Gospel is introduced with an acclamation such as

◆ Alleluia, alleluia.
Come, Holy Spirit,
fill the hearts of your faithful people
and kindle in them the fire of your love.

All **Alleluia**

◆ Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ
according to N.

All **Glory to you, O Lord.**

At the end

◆ This is the Gospel of the Lord.

All **Praise to you, O Christ.**

ACTIVITY

We may have an activity for those who are young, or young at heart – either now or at another point in the service

SERMON OR REFLECTION

We sit



AFFIRMING OUR FAITH

Please stand

Let us affirm our faith in God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

Do you believe and trust in God the Father, source of all being and life, the one for whom we exist?

All **We believe and trust in him.**

Do you believe and trust in God the Son, who took our human nature, died for us and rose again?

All **We believe and trust in him.**

Do you believe and trust in God the Holy Spirit, who gives life to the people of God and makes Christ known in the world?

All **We believe and trust in him.**

This is the faith of the Church.

All **This is our faith.
We believe and trust in one God,
Father, Son and Holy Spirit.
Amen.**



PRAYERS OF PENITENCE

- ◆ The Spirit of the Lord fills the world and knows our every word and deed. Let us then open ourselves to the Lord and confess our sins in penitence and faith.
- ◆ You pour our your Spirit upon all flesh; we try to fence her in.
Lord, have mercy.
All **Lord, have mercy.**
- ◆ You speak through many languages; we block out foreign accents.
Christ, have mercy.
All **Christ, have mercy.**
- ◆ You make one body from all our gifts; we refuse to be connected.
Lord, have mercy.
All **Lord, have mercy.**

The minister assures us of God's forgiveness, in these or other words

May the God of love and power forgive *us* and free *us* from our sins, heal and strengthen *us* by his Spirit and raise *us* to new life in Christ our Lord.

All **Amen.**

◆ Blessed is the Lord,
All **for he has heard
the voice of our prayer;**

◆ therefore shall our hearts dance for joy
All **and in our song
will we praise our God.**

PRAYING FOR OTHERS

We sit or kneel

One of these responses, or another, may be used

Either

Lord, come to bless us
All **and fill us with your Spirit.**

And at the end

Generous God,
you sent your Holy Spirit
upon your Messiah at the river Jordan,
and upon the disciples in the upper room:
in your mercy fill us with your Spirit,
All **hear our prayer,
and make us one in heart and mind
to serve you with joy for ever.
Amen.**

Or

Lord, in your mercy
All **Hear our prayer.**

And at the end

Merciful Father
All **Accept these prayers
for the sake of your Son,
our Saviour, Jesus Christ.
Amen**
