Our common home is crying out to be cherished, and our thankful praise should stir us to action and to tread more gently on the earth and care for our shared environment.

In recent years the Church of England, along with the Orthodox Churches, the Roman Catholic Church and any other churches, has observed the Season of Creation from 1st September to the feast of St Francis of Assisi (4th October), as a time for the whole church to proclaim

"The earth is the Lord's and all that is in it."

Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us. Lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil. For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours, now and for ever. Amen.
